Pursuant to wildlife conservation and management Act 2013 section 41, Community wildlife association and wildlife manager are expected to have strategies to address human wildlife conflicts, combat illegal poaching and monitoring of wildlife for sustainable management. Mara elephant project has been key in performing the above mentioned activities for the last four (4) years in Mara- Serengeti ecosystem. Of late, the MEP acquired a chopper 5Y REE that has been of significance use in facilitating:

- Monitoring of wildlife distribution in Mara ecosystem.
- > Attending to sick/injured wildlife
- > Driving of wildlife from community crop farms
- Ferrying security personnel to address security conflicts / challenges in the ecosystem.

In view of the above, I introduce and recommend MEP to any potential conservation donor to fund the Mara elephant program in order to have more strategic aerial recc and patrols in protecting and monitoring of wildlife in Mara- Serengeti ecosystem.
